Angelo State University- The Blue and Gold Guarantee Program covers eight semesters (summer terms not included) of tuition and mandatory fees for students demonstrating financial need. To qualify, a student must: 1. Be a bona fide Texas resident, 2. Be entering college as a first-time freshman, 3. Have a combined family Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) of \$40,000 or less, 4. Be eligible for the Federal Pell Grant Program, 5. Complete all financial aid application requirements by the published priority application deadline (April 1), 6. Enroll in and maintain a minimum of 15 semester credit hours, 7. Meet and maintain the minimum standards of ASU's Satisfactory Academic Progress policy.

Rice University- Rice continues a policy of need-blind admission and meeting 100 percent of demonstrated need. For families whose income is \$80,000 or less, Rice will meet 100 percent of need eligibility without loans. That means these students' financial aid packages will be covered by scholarships, grants, work study and other aid. For those whose income is above \$80,000 and who are need eligible, Rice will cap the amount of loans in financial aid packages at \$10,000 for the four undergraduate years (as long as they remain eligible for need-based aid). Texas A&M University- The Aggie Assurance aids students with a family income of \$60,000 or less by pledging to provide enough scholarships and grants to pay tuition for all eligible students. FAFSA form must be completed by March 31st priority deadline.

Texas Tech University- The Red Raider Guarantee offers free tuition and mandatory fees up to 15 credit hours per semester to new entering freshmen who are Texas residents and enrolled full-time with family adjusted gross incomes that do not exceed \$40,000. Eligible students must apply, be accepted for admission and have a complete financial aid file before May 1, 2009, to receive the guaranteed funds.

The University of Arlington- UTA provides grant assistance to cover all fall and spring tuition and fees for undergraduate Texas residents who have a family income of \$25,000 or less.

The University of North Texas- The Emerald Eagle Scholars Program is available to new entering freshmen whose family's adjusted gross income does not exceed \$40,000. The program encourages academic success and timely completion of a bachelor's degree. For eligibility enrollment requirements, visit: www.unt.edu/emeraldscholars

Military Dependents Financial Assistance

*There are many educational benefits afforded to veterans of the United States Armed Services and their dependents. Below is specific information on a recent State of Texas funded benefit:

The Hazlewood Act- Provides qualified veterans, spouses, and children with an education benefit of up to 150 hours of tuition and fee exemptions at state supported colleges or universities. Effective with the fall 2009 term/semester, in order to be eligible to receive a Hazlewood Act Exemption, a veteran must:

1. Have been a Texas resident upon entry into the military, entered the service in the State of Texas, or declared Texas as his or her home of record;
2. Have a military discharge of honorable or general, under honorable conditions;
3. Served at least 181 days of active duty service (excluding training);
4. Not be in default on an education loan made or guaranteed by the State of Texas.

Transferability of Benefits (Legacy Program)- Eligible veterans may assign unused hours of exemption eligibility to a child under certain conditions. To be eligible, the child must:

1. Be a Texas resident,
2. Be the biological child, stepchild, adopted child, or claimed as a dependent in the current or previous tax year,
3. Be 25 years or younger on the first day of the semester or term for which the exemption is claimed (unless granted an extension due to a qualifying illness or debilitating condition), and
4. Make satisfactory academic progress in a degree, certificate, or continuing education program as determined by the institution.
