**Concert Choir** (listed as Mixed Choir 1-4) is the only non-auditioned choir at Hebron HS. The choir performs in all concerts, competes at UIL Concert and Sight-reading Contest and members are participants in the LISD Solo and Ensemble Contest. Students in the Concert Choir are graded on individual participation, group oral tests and rehearsal and performance attendance. **Students are encouraged to remain in this class for a full year.**

***Belle Chanson*** (listed as Treble Choir 1-4) is an auditioned group for just women's voices. These ladies will sing three and four part harmonies. Select Treble members will perform in all HHS choir concerts, UIL Concert and Sight-reading Contest and will participate in the LISD Solo and Ensemble Contest. Select Treble Ensemble may also be asked to perform at other community and school events during the year. Select Treble Ensemble members will be graded on class participation, oral tests, and rehearsal and concert attendance. **Belle Chanson members must remain in choir for a full year unless given special permission by the director.**

***A Cappella Choir*** (listed as Vocal Ensemble 1-4) is the varsity choir of Hebron HS. A spring audition will be held to select these vocal students. The A Cappella Choir sings at all HHS choir concerts, LISD and UIL competitions (solos and ensembles) and its members are the ALL STATE CHOIR audition participants who represent HHS during the fall auditions. Students in this choir will be expected to learn and perform music at a faster pace. They will be evaluated on the basis of participation, individual and group oral tests, and attendance to various rehearsals and performance during the year. A Cappella performs at several community and civic events during the school year. A Cappella members are urged to attend a summer choir camp to prepare for Texas All-State auditions. **A Cappella students must remain in the choir for a full year.**

***HARMONY!*** is the Hebron High School Show Choir. Members of Harmony will be selected during a spring audition (after April 22<sup>th</sup>) and must be chosen as a member of A Cappella choir for 2010-2011 school year to participate. This group will meet 2 times a week outside the school day. **Harmony competes during the spring choir trip so members must attend.** The group will have a different uniform and will incorporate choreography into their program. This group will have 8-16 members.

Auditions for A Cappella Choir and Belle Chanson will be held on **April 22, 2010 at 4:15 p.m.** in the HHS Choir Room. Judges will hear students sing "My Country 'Tis of Thee" a cappella and another song with CD accompaniment (provided by the HHS directors). Students will also sight-read an eight-measure melody. An information audition packet will be available to students during April. Both songs must be memorized for the audition.

Students are graded on individual participation, playing tests, written tests, rehearsal attendance and performance attendance. Students are selected during the spring audition. Eligible Symphonic members may have an opportunity to audition for Chamber orchestra during winter auditions. Class meets during 3rd period.

**Chamber Orchestra** is the Hebron HS varsity orchestra. Students will learn challenging music and perform in the school musical and special events. Private lessons are strongly recommended. Members are expected to learn and perform music at a faster pace, and are required to participate in All-District/All-Region auditions and LISD Solo and Ensemble contest. Students are graded on individual participation, playing tests, written tests, rehearsal attendance and performance attendance. Students are selected during the spring audition and winter auditions (current members only). Class meets during 4<sup>th</sup> period.

- \* Must fill out an application and have it validated by counselor.

**Theatre Arts I** - This class is designed to allow any student experience the fundamentals of theatre, and students may fulfill fine arts and elective requirements for graduation by successfully completing Theatre Arts I (one credit). All Students must complete this course before entering *ENCORE PRODUCTIONS OR BRAVO*.

The knowledge and skills pursued in this course will cover four strands:

- **Perception.** The student develops concepts about self, human relationships, and the environment, using elements of drama and conventions of theatre. *Examples: improvisation, preparation/warm-ups, movement, voice, text analysis, theatre conventions, and interdependence.*
- **Creative Expression/Performance.** Creative expression/performance. The student interprets characters, using the voice and body expressively, and creates dramatizations. The student applies design, directing, and the theatre production concepts and skills. *Examples: safety, character analysis, acting, playwriting, design and technical elements, directing, applied production, and specialization.*

- **Historical/cultural heritage.** The student relates theatre to history, society, and culture. *Examples: historical and cultural influences.*
- **Response/evaluation.** The student responds to and evaluates theatre and theatrical performances. *Examples: theater etiquette, criticism, interdisciplinary, careers and vocational pursuits.*

**Bravo** - This is the J.V. acting class. The design of this class is to prepare students for *ENCORE PRODUCTIONS*. Building on the fundamental skills taught in theatre I, the class will produce two plays with in the school year. Advanced techniques such as stage make up, directing, and character study will be explored within the study of this course. This class requires after and before school responsibilities and is under the UIL guidelines. This class will also prepare actors for auditions and the UIL One Act Play Competition. Upon auditioning for this class, students must have completed theatre arts I and have director approval. Students must audition to be considered for this class.

**Encore Productions** - This is the Varsity acting class. In this class students will produce at least three plays which includes the UIL One Act Play competition piece. Students are also required to participate in the Fine Arts Musical production. This class is high speed class that will cover many genres of theatre history, and performance. This class requires after and before school responsibilities and is under the UIL guidelines. This class will also prepare actors for auditions and the UIL One Act Play Competition. Upon auditioning for this class, students must have completed theatre arts I and have director approval. Students must audition to be considered for this class. Students must also be enrolled for a full year to participate in this class.

**Technical Theatre I (Theatrical Design)** - Students in this class will learn the basics of Theatre Tech: stage management; lights, sound, costuming, and set design; as well as learning the basics of set construction. The goal of this class is to prepare students to have active roles in the productions we produce throughout the course of the year. **STUDENTS WILL BE BUILDING SETS DURING THIS COURSE!** This is a semester (half-year) course.

**Technical Theatre I (Costuming)** - Students will focus on learning the techniques to create and build costumes for the theatre productions. They will engage in cutting, altering, reading patterns, and will construct costumes for current Hebron Theatre shows. They will learn the fundamentals of drawing and designing costumes for characters in shows. Students will also learn about make-up and hair design as well as techniques for application, and gain practical experience in this field.

**Advanced Technical Theatre** - Students in this class will be expected to know all of the information from Tech I, as well as the new instruction they will receive while becoming more active within the Theatre Department. As a requirement of the class, students are expected to participate on Crew for every play the department produces. Students will learn intelligent lighting, detailed set design and construction techniques, and leadership skills needed to be an effective Stage Manager – just to name a few things! All of these skills will be helpful in creating great Techies for our UIL One-Act Play Competition.
